Vincentian Reflection for Palm Sunday of our Lord's Passion
April 2, 2023

Gospel: (Matthew 21: 1-11 and 26: 14-27) When Jesus and the disciples drew near Jerusalem and came to Bethpage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, “Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tethered, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them here to me. And if anyone should say anything to you, reply, ‘The Master has need of them.’” ...The crowds preceding Him kept crying out and saying: “Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest.” After they had crucified Him, they divided His garments by casting lots. The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said, “Truly, this was the Son of God!”

Reflection: From the high hosanna acclamation to the low of betrayal, denial, and abandonment the gospel take us up and down to the brink of life itself. Like the disciples, we also know who Jesus is. Every Sunday we make our profession of faith: “We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God...” This Palm Sunday we are invited to reflect on our own knowledge of who Jesus is and how well we confess Him in our daily living. It is a daily choice to live the gospel’s requirement that we die to ourselves for the sake of others. This is how we confess Jesus as the Son of God. This is how, rather than denial and abandonment, we come to stand at the cross with Jesus. (*Living Liturgy*, p 88)

Vincentian Meditation: “The earth has grown cold. It is for us Catholics to revive the vital beat to restore it, it is for us to begin over again the great work of regeneration, if necessary to bring back the era of the martyrs. For to be a martyr is possible for every Christian, to be a martyr is to give his life for God and his brothers, to give his life in sacrifice, whether the sacrifice be consumed in an instant like a holocaust, or be accomplished slowly and smoke night and day like perfume on the altar. To be a martyr is to give back to heaven all that one has received: his money, his blood, his whole soul.” Bl. Frederic Ozanam (*Letter 90, to Curnier, 1835*)

Indeed, the “Master has need of us” to rekindle the vital fire which has been extinguished in our world.

What form has martyrdom taken for you or for those who are dear to you?

Health Insurance Navigation Services Available for Our Neighbors



Could a neighbor you are serving use some help understanding their options when it comes to health insurance? **St. Vincent de Paul's Health Insurance Navigator, Beverly Ramsay**, provides free, professional counseling through in-person appointments at our Neyer Outreach Center (NOC, 1146 Bank St). Beverly is currently onsite with us on

Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, but may offer expanded hours in the coming weeks, as some of our neighbors are expected to lose Medicaid coverage due to COVID-19 emergency operations ending.

Please have neighbors call Beverly directly at 513.345.4997 to set an appointment with her. This will allow Beverly to let neighbors know what documents and information to bring, and to get a general sense of their needs.

We are grateful to have Beverly provide this crucial service, made available through our partnership with the **Charitable Healthcare Network (CHN)**. What a wonderful complement to the good works of our **Charitable Pharmacy!**

Medicaid Unwinding - and How You Can Help

We have recently highlighted impending changes in the administration of Medicaid. Our State of Ohio has announced an aggressive timeline beginning this April - in just a few days - with rolling Medicaid cancellations on May 1, June 1, & July 1. As we approach the end of Q2 (this Fri, 3/31) of this fiscal year...

- Reminder to get your check registers for this quarter's 3 months (Jan - March) closed out and confirm their accuracy
- Ensure all of your applicable financial transactions for assistance to neighbors are in CMS cases
- Your Conference statistics report on the SVDP website, updated through Q2, should be available on Monday 4/3/2023

- Please be cognizant of **not** creating duplicate "client records" in CMS when doing

- new cases for neighbors
- CMS Admins should be reviewing merge requests submitted from their Conference members

Free Income Tax Preparation Services Available

It is tax filing season. And for many of our neighbors feeling the financial squeeze, a tax refund is at least a short-term solution within their reach...sometimes with a little help.

Free Tax Prep, an initiative of United Way of Greater Cincinnati funded by the IRS, provides free (federal & state) income tax preparation and filing services for low to moderate income neighbors residing in our Greater Cincinnati area. These same services are available to neighbors on fixed incomes, neighbors with disabilities, and those with limited English language abilities. Conference Assistance Fund (CAF)

Our February activity:

- We received **182** fresh applications
- We approved **167** applications, fully extended our February CAF funding provisions of approx \$75,000 (including carryover); **4** were declined and **6** withdrawn

Our March activity (4 weeks in, 3 days to go):

- We've received **152** fresh applications
- We've approved **134** applications; 4 have been withdrawn and **0** declined
- We have **11** applications currently in process
- We are approaching our **\$70,000** monthly funding cap from Council

Thanks to augmented funding from our District Council, our CAF provisions are \$70,000/month for the remainder of this fiscal year (March - September), plus any twinning to CAF by Conferences sharing a resource surplus.

We continue to encourage you to guide our neighbors to other publicly- & privately-funded resources available within our community...and to nurture relationships that extend well beyond immediate basic needs (material) assistance to provide lasting impact. Budgeting can be an eye-opening exercise that leads to changes to create a sustainable, livable new monthly model. How will our neighbor pay their rent, utilities, and other bills in the months to come?

Emergency Rental Assistance 2 (ERA2) - A Fresh Round

We've received a funding allocation from the City of Cincinnati to once again partner to assist neighbors with their rent and utility arrearages through the ERA2 program. This

funding is similar to the previous round; please note these parameters:

- We have begun accepting applications and will continue to do so until 6/13/23, or when our allocation is completely extended
- We have maximum available funds of \$200,000 to be extended through your/our Conferences
- We will only be able to assist neighbors who rent within the City of Cincinnati
- Eligible neighbors will be able to receive up to 15 months of rent and utility arrearages
- Our neighbor must have been impacted in some capacity by COVID
- We are recommending that neighbors with a minimum of \$1,000 in arrearages should apply for this funding; any lesser amounts would likely be good candidates for CAF, assuming the neighbor is eligible
- Assistance can only apply to balances accrued after March 13, 2020

Rahe Beds Fund & Program

It's nearly April, which means it's time to submit your April bed requests. We will again accept five requests per Conference, through April 5. Our online request form can be found [here](#). Please submit only one form per Conference. Each month, we will evaluate the number of vouchers we can extend based on the number of vouchers that have been redeemed. In recent months, we've been providing vouchers for significantly more beds than we have the budget to cover, due to low redemption rates. Now that our redemption rates are picking up, we need to pull back slightly the number of vouchers we extend. While fewer vouchers may seem like bad news, the reality is that **more neighbors are receiving beds than they were before**.

One update regarding vouchers: We are only able to rewrite vouchers that were written within the last six months. If a voucher expired more than six months ago, the neighbor will need to request the voucher again.

New Contact Information for Bed Purchases! Your purchased beds will be picked up at our Clothing & Home Resource Center (CHRC) within our Liz Carter Center (LCC), 1125 Bank St. - the same place our Rahe bed vouchers are redeemed.

A limited number of pack 'n' plays are available for neighbors with children younger than two. They can be requested by emailing rahebedfund@svdpcincinnati.org with the neighbor's name, date of birth, and address.

Housing Choice Voucher Program

As presented in our 2/15/2023 Resource Spotlight, Annina Ruggley of our Council's Social Services team is accepting neighbor recommendations for the Housing Choice Voucher program. This program works to assist neighbors in obtaining a Section 8 voucher, which would allow neighbors to rent from private landlords at a reduced rate, based upon a proportion of their income, with CMHA covering the remaining balance. The rental property must be located in Hamilton County. Ideal candidates for this program are neighbors whose income is not currently enough to address their expenses, are housed or are moving into housing that is likely to pass inspection, and have enough income/assistance each month to enable them to pay at least \$50 a month for rent. To make a recommendation, please complete a Housing Choice Voucher screening tool, which can be found along with supporting materials on the Member Support and Forms page of our SVDP-Cincinnati website. Please add thorough notes about the neighbor's situation and income, and email the completed form to Nina Ruggley at aruggley@svdpcincinnati.org. Nina will also be happy to answer any questions you have

about this program, 513.345.4965.

Metro Bus Passes (Everybody Rides Metro)

Your Conference has access to Metro single-day bus passes to be extended to neighbors for use for any of 3 defined purposes:

1. Commute to/from new employment
2. Commute to/from our Bank St services hub or other community social services
3. Commute to/from medical appointments

Please understand that these passes are sourced through the Everybody Rides Metro program and our Council is required to comply with the above-referenced usages and submit reports of passes distributed. Please also understand that your Conference will need to record bus passes extended in CMS for the neighbors receiving this assistance.

Birth Certificates

Our Neyer Outreach Center (NOC) team is assisting neighbors who are in need of a birth certificate. We have enhanced our process so that neighbors may request and receive a birth certificate on the same day. Neighbors should come to our NOC (1146 Bank St) and request the birth certificate. They will then be given documentation to take to Elm Street Clinic (1525 Elm St) where they may retrieve their birth certificate on the same day, or at their convenience. A limited number of birth certificates are available each week, and all birth certificate requests must be made in person.

Cooking Improv with La Soupe

Our partner La Soupe teams with our Catino Choice Pantry to present monthly Cooking Improv demonstrations in the Teaching Kitchen at our NOC. Instructors from La Soupe and volunteers engage participants on basic cooking principles and how to use what you have to create delicious, nutritious meals. **All recipes are based off ingredients found daily in our Catino Choice Pantry. Neighbors are encouraged to sample the delicious dishes and discuss preparation and ingredients with our staff, volunteers, and resident La Soupe instructor, Chef Mona!**

These sessions are held on the first Wednesday of each month - which means **our next event is this coming Wednesday, 4/5, 11am-1pm**. No pre-registration is required.

Feel free to share this information with your neighbors.

Haircuts from the Heart in our NOC

This is a free haircut program, courtesy of our partner Franciscan Ministries. **Stylist Margarita is in our NOC every Monday, 9am-noon**, cutting hair in a room on the 2nd floor. Neighbors are accepted on a walk-in basis, and should sign in at our NOC reception desk upon arrival.

Education Center Within Our Neyer Outreach Center

Our NOC Education Center is available for our neighbors and Vincentians to use during our operating hours: Monday - Friday, 8am - 4pm, and Saturday, 8am - noon.

Language Service Available to our Conferences

A growing number of our Conferences are experiencing increased interactions with Latino members of our community...and are struggling to effectively communicate with neighbors who are most fluent or exclusively fluent in Spanish. We have contracted a dedicated language service to help you engage these neighbors in a welcoming, affirming manner. Any Conference member can download the "LanguageLine InSight" app on your smartphone, tablet, or computer at <https://insight.languageline.com/>. You simply need to use the Authentication Code **6NN692GLS2** the first time you login. Through this app you will have access to over 40 different languages, including Spanish, via an interpreter. You will have the option of either audio or visual (for those needing sign language); we strongly encourage using visual only when you must. **Please be efficient in your utilization as our Council pays by the minute for this service; and visual is nearly twice as expensive as audio. When you access the service, you will be asked for your name**

and department, you simply need to state your name, then “St Vincent de Paul Cincinnati Conferences”, then your Conference name. Be sure to only call through the app; you cannot use this service through a regular phone call.

Our Charitable Pharmacy, Social Services, and some Conferences are leveraging this tool to better engage our Latino neighbors.

If you have any questions or are having trouble accessing the service, please reach out to Alec or Olivia of your Vincentian Services team.

If your Conference is among those engaging more neighbors preferring or needing to communicate in Spanish, please consider this an opportunity to seek the addition of Spanish-speaking members. This could enhance your responsive communication and expand your Conference’s perspective.

Christ Church Plumb Line

This greatly appreciated community resource extends financial aid for qualified neighbors who are employed. Volunteers @ Christ Church are administering the Plumb Line on Mondays, 1-3pm, and scheduling in-person meetings for applicants for the following Monday (example: Volunteers in on 4/3 will be scheduling appointments for 4/10). **Please note: Since the volunteers @ Christ Church prefer to do an in-person interview with neighbors referred to them whenever possible, please be sure to tell the neighbor to expect Christ Church to reach out for an in-person interview when you are filling out a Plumb Line referral form with/for your neighbor.**

Greater Cincinnati Water Works (GCWW)

GCWW's **Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA) Program** provides funds for assistance for eligible tenants residing in the City of Cincinnati. There are eligibility stipulations.

Tenants must qualify by completing an online application at assistance.mygcww.org . Renters can also call 513.591.7700 to receive assistance from the call center to complete an application. There is also a flexible payment plan through the PromisePay Portal.

Should our neighbor / their customer not meet Duke's qualifications for assistance, please refer them to Duke's customer care organization at 800.544.6900 where they may find assistance through a flexible installment plan.

State of Ohio Program for Struggling Homeowners

Save the Dream Ohio helps eligible Ohio homeowners facing foreclosure and/or who cannot afford to pay their mortgage payments, utility payments or other related housing costs as a result of economic hardship caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. The state of Ohio was awarded \$280 million from the U.S. Department of Treasury through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 for the program. Click here for more information:

The Vision Clinic operates **by appointment** on certain Monday mornings & Thursdays as designated by CEIF. **This Vision Clinic will be open on Thursdays in March, including all day tomorrow (3/30). Please watch for our April schedule in next week's edition.**
